DerryVolgieKids Online









DVK Online is our kids' ministry programme that has been running on Friday nights since September. Each session lasts about 30 minutes on Zoom; we watch a video Bible story, followed by a short discussion or quiz. We have learnt about the early days of Jesus' ministry and about some Old Testament characters including: David, Daniel, Jonah and Joshua. In every story we learn or are reminded about God's character, whether that's his faithfulness, goodness or power; there is always something to encourage us.

We play online-friendly games (scavenger hunts have proved very popular!) and do activities such as a memory verse challenge or prayer activity. Each week the kids get a chance to share their news: birthdays, wobbly teeth, reading achievements . . . the leaders love hearing their stories.

After a successful Christmas party where the kids received craft packs, we decided to include craft in the programme every so often and give the kids an opportunity to be creative.

Although meeting online is not the same as meeting face to face, it's an opportunity for the kids to connect with each other and the leaders, and to learn more of God's character, which in times like these is a great encouragement and comfort to us all.










DerryVolgie Youth Update

Every other Friday evening we have met online via zoom for games, activities, and Bible studies. Before Christmas, we focused on the group getting to know each other with a few Bible studies and many games (including some very frustrating ones from Jonny McMurray...)

Thanks to Jonny Rainey (Belfast Bible College student on placement from October to January), we have an exciting Bible study series from January to June of this year focusing on the 'big questions' out there such as 'How can I have Faith?' and 'Who and what is the Holy Spirit?'. This series uses the Youth Alpha Film series to help guide and promote discussion among young people to help make their faith real to them and help answer these questions they may have. A devotional has been sent out to the young people to help provide context for this series we will be going through.

We are very excited about this group of young people, and are excited to get to know them more. We are hopeful and pray that we will be able to meet in person soon as a group.

Christmas Carol Service - With a difference



If I asked you to describe Christmas 2020 in one word, I wonder what it would be? For many perhaps they'd say lonely or quiet, but I assume many would say different. There has been a lot of difference over the past year, a lot of changing circumstances in our lives but the one thing that doesn't change is that the baby born in a stable is still Emmanuel, God with us.

For our Carol Service this year we had a lot of thinking to do, we knew, regardless of the current restrictions, that it was always going to be different but as we discovered, different is not always bad, in fact it can turn out better than ever imagined. Approaching Christmas local restrictions were rapidly changing on a weekly basis and it was impossible to predict whether or not we would be able to gather in person for the service. With this in mind we decided to pre-record a good portion of the service until we knew closer to the time what specific restrictions were.

With the help of Wilson Lynn, our resident videographer and our amazing tech team, we had an evening of recording carols in the church. In addition, we recorded readings both within the church as well as other locations, such as a windy Divis mountain. Closer to the time it was announced we could have the service in person but also stream online to those who were unable to be there. And so, on Sunday 13th December we held our annual Christmas Carol Service.

Christmas 2020 seemed to be celebrated earlier than ever, we saw Christmas pyjamas in the shops in early November and colourful lights around our cul-de-sacs. We needed Christmas more than ever this year. In the run up it appeared as if the world was falling apart and we wouldn't have a perfect Christmas as dreamed. But when we think about the first ever Christmas it was far from perfect, in fact it was full of scandal - a baby born to an unmarried teenage girl in an unhygienic stable. As we approached Christmas 2020 our minds were weary and filled with headlines about vaccines, homelessness and refugees but these were true of the first Christmas also. As the Savior entered the world in a dirty stable there was illness, struggle for power and many familiar things to us today. But that baby born in the smelly manger brings us hope, for with a thrill of hope the weary world rejoices. Hope was infused throughout our Carol Service that regardless of what happens on earth the baby born in a stable conquered it all on the cross and this Christmas we needed to be reminded of that more than ever.

I don't know where you are reading this today, perhaps you're feeling a little heavy hearted with all that's *still* going on in the world but please know that Emmanuel is not just for Christmas. We may be distant from one another at the moment but Emmanuel is with us, right where we are in this moment and he'll be with us till the end. A Favourite Hymn



"Morning has broken, like the first morning"

"Morning has broken" is a hymn that is sung often in church. It is a favourite hymn of many. Indeed, in the 1970s, some people may remember that it was also a hit recording for the singer, Cat Stevens. It is a hymn appropriate to springtime with the rebirth of nature it brings. It is a short and quite modern hymn. In simple language, the hymn describes the daily routine of nature, as it brings with it new light each day, birds singing, dew on the grass, rain to encourage growth and so on. In gentle terms, the hymn reminds us to appreciate

and give thanks for each new day. The last two lines are especially appropriate with their invitation: "Praise with elation, praise every morning, God's recreation of the new day." They remind us of the lines in Lamentations 3:22-23: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases: his mercies never come to an end; They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Our lives recently have been affected by the pandemic and coronavirus. It has been difficult to ignore anxieties and uncertainties. Perhaps the situation has caused us to look differently at life. It has been hard not to be obsessed by statistics, restrictions, etc. And yet, just recently, maybe hope has started to appear again. Just as the "blackbird's singing" and "the rain's new fall" make their appearance each day, so too vaccines have recently made an appearance. Hopefully, they will offer protection against the virus. Hopefully, they will help us to appreciate life fully again. And so, in a sense that is different from what the hymn refers to, maybe, soon, we can once again, be mindful and praise "God's re-creation of the new day."

Revision of the Vestry Register

The Register of General Vestry Members at the Parish of Derryvolgie is open for review from Monday 8th February and is available for inspection upon request. Those whose names appear on the register are eligible to vote at the Annual Meeting and are eligible to be nominated and elected to the Select Vestry, subject to their consent. If your name is not already on the Register of Vestry Members and you wish to have it added, you must:

- Be over 18 years of age.
- Subscribe to Parish funds in such a way that is recordable.

You must sign a Form of Declaration, which can be obtained from the Resources section of our website. These forms need to be signed and returned to the Rector or Church Wardens before Monday 8th March 2021 at 7.30pm when the review meeting will take place. The Select Vestry will receive the Forms of Declaration,

and if there are no objections, the names of all qualified persons who have completed Forms of Declaration shall be added to the Register. The names of those who are no longer qualified (that is those who have left the Parish or those who no longer subscribe to the Parish) will be removed from the Register. Please contact the Rector/Treasurer if you wish to discuss your financial contributions to the parish.

STAY HOME PROTECT THE NHS SAVE LIVES

COVID 19 Update

In all walks of life, we are hearing the message 'stay at home.' This has become necessary to ensure we minimise contact with those who are not from our household thus helping to curb the spread of COVID 19. Since we re-opened after the first lockdown in September, we have made every effort and taken all necessary steps to ensure the safety of those who visit our buildings. This is something we have continually evaluated and often put in place extra measures over and above the basic requirements.

With the infection rate rising in early January, we once again closed the doors of our buildings having taken advice from both the Government and the Diocese of Connor.

This decision was re-evaluated in late January and our buildings will remain closed until at least 5th March (with the exceptions of funerals and weddings which are limited to 25 people) when we will once again review the situation.

Our Sunday services, Kids, Youth and Life Groups all continue online. If you need more information about these, please do get in touch.

Thank you for your continued support and as I said many times during the first lockdown 'when people know they are known and loved by you and by Jesus a beautiful legacy will come out of this awful mess.'

CEP (Centro de Estudios Pastorales) Audio project

Thank you for this opportunity to write in a piece for the Derryvolgie magazine!

CEP is the Chilean Anglican Church's training institution. The three-year course has been in operation for approximately 15 years. Each year group has in the region of 7-10 students who come from Chile and beyond (e.g., Peru, Argentina). Before the call to ordination has been recognised by the Bishop and Diocesan structures, an individual has to show that they have undergone suitable training. CEP has been a wonderful strategic addition to the Chilean church as it seeks to train leaders for the future.

This past pandemic year has revealed an opportunity for CEP to expand its reach in Chile (and beyond). Due to the vast distances involved (Chile is 4000km long), training in Chile has been curtailed somewhat. There are

other potential theological students who have been identified, but are unable to fulfil training requirements

due to logistical issues of travel and relocation.

Under the direction of the Principal Cris Cerón, CEP is now planning to increasingly deliver quality Theological training via internet training platforms to HUBS up and down the vast length of Chile.

SAMS Ireland has been approached by CEP with a project proposal which would see the purchase of specific Audio-Visual equipment. Once people have been trained in its use, lectures will be recorded for posting on CEP training portals. This will allow greater access too much needed theological training material.

I am delighted that Derryvolgie has seen planned involvement with this CEP Audio Visual project as a very practical way of helping overseas mission work. I have heard that your own recent installation of equipment has made a positive contribution in people's ability to engage with weekly worship on site and on-line. This will become more important in the future. As your former Rector, I can wholeheartedly recommend this CEP project for your continued prayerful consideration. Derryvolgie Parish has been a faithful supporter for South American Mission Society for many years. This focused act of generosity will have far reaching positive effects for the Gospel in Chile and beyond.
